Instructions for Completing the Racial and Ethnic Data Form

- The provider must complete this form each year.
- The provider may use visual identification to determine a child's racial or ethnic category or the parent/guardian may be asked to identify the racial or ethnic group of their child(ren). A child may be included in the group that he/she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded as a member by the community.
- To allow flexibility and ensure data quality, separate categories shall be used when collecting and reporting race and ethnicity. Ethnicity shall be collected first.
- The home sponsor must retain racial and ethnic data for 3 years plus the current year and must safeguard this information to prevent its use for discriminatory purposes. Access to Program records containing racial or ethnic data should be limited to authorized personnel.
